Anyone in Russia, regardless of their citizenship and nationality, insurance policy and other papers, is entitled to FREE emergency medical care.¹

Emergency care is provided in situations which pose an immediate threat to life and require urgent medical intervention.

Free emergency care is provided only in public hospitals.

Emergency ambulance numbers in all Russian cities are 103 or 112 for a mobile phone (an ambulance can be called even from a locked phone). When calling an ambulance, tell the operator what has happened, where the injured person is, and answer any questions the operator may ask.

YOU SHOULD CALL AN AMBULANCE:

- when someone is seriously injured, e.g. in a car crash or by falling out of a window
- if a person is unconscious
- in case of a serious accident
- in case of severe bleeding
- in case of serious poisoning
- if a pregnant woman has contractions or acute sudden pain

Remember that emergency medical care is your right. An ambulance cannot refuse to help you even if you do not have a medical insurance policy or any other paperwork.
